
Steve our new handyman has created a lovely new seating area for our Honey Bees

Parent Reminders

Could I ask all parents to ensure all coats, bags and any other items are labelled with their child's names or initials please. Also, when bringing in bags, can you make sure nothing is left inside such as sun cream, hand gel, objects etc as these may be harmful to the children.

A little reminder if you could let us know if your child is going to be off each day or going on holiday and where to just so we can keep our records up to date. You can let us know by phoning, emailing or on the Eylog. You will need to fill in a health questionnaire on your return. Thank you

If you child has had any pain relief (Calpol or Ibuprofen) in the last 24 hours they are not able to attend nursery. Pain relief can mask Covid-19 symptoms, such as a high temperature.

For any families travelling abroad, you will need to follow the 14-day quarantine rules if in place for that destination upon your return. You will also be required to complete a quick health questionnaire for your child before returning to nursery.






Dates to Remember
