The children will be going into the Forest School within their bubbles to collect leaves and learn about the changing seasons. They will be encouraged to use their senses to notice the world around them and listen to all the different sounds such as the leaves crunching under their feet, birds singing and the sound of trees moving in the wind. The children will collect many interesting natural materials in the garden such as leaves, twigs and conkers which will be used to create wonderful nature art with collages and paintings. This will promote learning for our Eco School Committee with the Bizzy Bees children who are learning all about taking care of our planet and nature.

Bizzy Bees

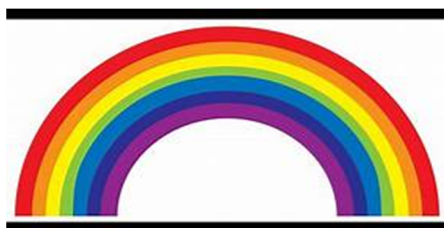
