<u>Events</u>

5/12/2020 – World Soil Day – This is an annual awareness day to raise awareness of the importance of soil quality for human wellbeing, food security and ecosystems. The children will be exploring soil in the garden and helping to plant and look after our wildlife garden.

Every day during this week we will be making it fun with Christmas activities, games and presents. Opening and closing times

Parents Notices

Can I remind all parents, when queuing to collect their child that you wear your mask (if you are exempt please let the office know as soon as possible) and wait your turn to buzz on the door. The staff will go as quickly as they can whilst ensuring the children are always kept safe. Thank you for your patience and cooperation.

Medication – Please refrain from bringing your child into Nursery if they have needed Calpol as this can mask a temperature which is a symptom of Covid 19, however, your child is permitted to attend nursery if they have had Calpol or any other pain relief medicine, once You filled out a declaration form at the door to confirm this is for teething/needles. Please make sure you have plenty time in the morning.

Antibiotics – It is that time of year again where many children may need antibiotics to help them along. This is to allow the antibiotic to start working and allow the parent time to observe their child for any adverse reactions. All children on antibiotics must remain home for the first 48 hours of the course.

Donations – If parents are sorting out their children's old clothes, can we ask that they are able to donate them to us, as spares, as we are running low on vests, underpants/knickers, socks, tops and pants for both girls and boys. We would greatly appreciate it. All clothing donated will be washed and sorted.
