#### Baby Bees

Our Baby Bees have been celebrating the Euros by colouring in their own football kits. This has helped support their fine motor skills whilst learning how to pick up the crayon and hold the crayon to draw. During this activity the staff named the different colours encouraging the children to repeat the colour back to us expanding on their vocabulary. We extended this activity outdoors by using the chalks in the garden to build on the children's gross motor skills by using a larger area to draw on.













#### Honey Bees

This month we have been focusing on the book 'going on a bear hunt' The children have taken part in creating artwork for our display and acting out scenes from the book in the garden. Morgan also made her own bear cut outs that she hid in the garden and the children re enacted the book with lots of props outdoors in the forest school to fin the bear! All the children have loved the exciting activities and reading this story, some of the children and even started to recall their favourite parts of the book!





## Bizzy Bees

Whilst some of the children have been off isolating last month, we decided to have a little change around in the room and enhance many of the areas in Bizzy Bees. We introduced a viewing point form the window that looks out into the garden adding bird watching charts, checklist for the different flowers they can see and some binoculars for the children to use whilst looking out. The children have been focusing on mathematics using the number bears to support





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number recognition and counting. We have also been exploring shapes and discussing with the children what different shapes they can see in the environment such as windows, doors, and signs.
