Parent Information

Did you know you could be eligible to claim Tax Free Childcare? The government will pay up to £2000 per year per child (aged 11 years and under). This could be as high as £4000 per year per child if you already claim DLA.

Research has shown that 75% of eligible families are not using Tax Free Childcare. It only takes about 20 minutes to check your eligibility and apply. Basically for every £8 you pay into an online account, the government will add an extra £2. It is definitely worth 20 minutes of your time to check your eligibility!
