


Tuniform Recycling – Give Old Uniforms a New Life!










Staff Recognition **\(\lambda**

This month in the garden, we've been focusing on developing the willow area. One exciting change is transforming our mud kitchen into a 'forest kitchen'. This new approach offers children broader opportunities for imaginative play, encouraging them to explore a variety of natural materials—not just mud.

To support this, We are adding a range of new resources and open-ended items that will inspire creativity and support learning through play. 
Water play has been a fantastic way for our toddlers to explore, create, and develop their early understanding of the world — all while having lots of fun in the sunshine!

Parents' Notice & Reminders <a>__

Dear Parents and Carers,

We kindly ask for your support with the following reminders to help us maintain a safe and smooth-running environment for all children:

Mobile Phones

Please do not use mobile phones inside the nursery building, including hallways. This helps us maintain a safe and focused environment for the children.

Warm Weather Essentials

As the weather warms up, please ensure your child arrives with:

- A hat
- Light, suitable clothing











- Sunglasses (optional but recommended)
- We provide factor 50 sun cream, but if your child requires their own, please supply it and leave it at the nursery.

Driveway Safety

Please take extra care when entering and exiting the nursery driveway. Be mindful of pedestrians and young children walking nearby. Drive slowly and safely.

Collection Time Reminder

Children must be collected by 5:45 PM. This ensures staff can give you a full handover and still have time to clean and prepare the rooms for the next day.

Bag Checks

Please do not leave items such as medication or cream in your child's bag. These must be handed to the office and a medication form completed. Also, no food should be brought in due to allergy risks. Thank you for your understanding.

Email Etiquette

When emailing us at nursery@kidzonenursery.com, please include your child's name and the nursery they attend in the subject line. This helps us respond to you more efficiently.

Toys from Home

To avoid any lost or broken items, please do not send toys from home with your child. This helps prevent unnecessary upset.

Nappies & Wipes

Please ensure your child's bag is restocked regularly with nappies and wipes, even if they are currently toilet training.

Policies

We regularly review our policies to ensure they reflect the latest guidance. You'll have received a copy upon registration, but please speak to the setting manager if you'd like the most up-to-date version.

Important: Funding Code Updates

To ensure we can claim your child's funded hours each term, please update your funding code every 3 months. You should receive reminder emails from HMRC, but we are noticing an increasing number of missed updates. Your cooperation is appreciated.
