
Staff Recognition - Celebrating Adele!


Money Bees





Our Honey Bees have been busy exploring the fascinating world of transport this month, and their enthusiasm has been wonderful to see. From cars and trains to aeroplanes soaring through the sky, the children have been developing their knowledge of how different vehicles move and what they are used for. They have enjoyed sharing their own experiences of travelling, asking lots of curious guestions, and learning new words to describe the vehicles they see around them.

This interest has carried over into their outdoor play, where the children have been working together to build their very own transport creations using the large construction blocks. With great imagination, they









have designed aeroplanes, trains, and cars, carefully balancing and stacking the blocks to bring their ideas to life. This type of play has encouraged teamwork and problem-solving as they negotiated roles, shared ideas, and worked out how to make their models strong and stable.

Through this theme, the Honey Bees have also been developing important skills across the EYFS curriculum. They have been counting wheels and carriages, comparing the sizes of their block vehicles, and exploring shapes and patterns in their designs. The children have been working hard on their new topic "What's That?" and have shown such curiosity and enthusiasm as they explored the world around them. They have been especially fascinated by things in the sky, spotting clouds, planes, hot air balloons, and much more. This has sparked lots of wonderful conversations and imaginative play, as the children shared their ideas and observations.



One of the highlights of the topic has been our game "What's That in the Bag?" which has encouraged the children to think critically, make predictions, and use descriptive language. It has been a joy to watch them grow in confidence as they guessed, discussed, and discovered what was hidden inside. This simple but powerful activity has supported their problem-solving skills and helped them to develop their vocabulary in a fun and engaging way.

The Bizzy Bees have also loved their sign language and Spanish sessions, where they have been learning new signs and picking up lots of Spanish words. These experiences have not only introduced them to new languages but also helped to build their listening, memory, and communication skills. 






Outdoor Learning




Important Reminders for Parents/Carers_




To help us maintain a safe, well-organised, and supportive environment for all children, we kindly ask that you take note of the following important reminders:











Mobile phones must not be used inside the building, including making calls or scrolling in the hallway. This is part of our commitment to safeguarding all children.

Funding Code Reconfirmation

Please ensure you reconfirm your child's funding code/information on the GOV.UK portal every 3 months. This is necessary to continue receiving funded childcare. Missing a reconfirmation could result in a temporary loss of your child's funded hours.

No Food in Baas

Do not bring food into the setting or leave food in your child's bag due to allergies within the nursery.

Bag Checks

Before coming to nursery, check your child's bag to ensure it does not contain any choking hazards, medications, or creams, unless previously discussed with staff.

Front Door Security

For safeguarding reasons, please do not let other parents in or hold the main door open when dropping off or collecting your child. It is important that we know who is entering/leaving the building at all times.

Policies

We regularly review our policies to ensure they reflect the latest guidance. You'll have received a copy upon registration, but please speak to the setting manager if you'd like the most up-to-date version.

Safeguarding Information

You and your child/children are very important to us. If we suspect any form of harm we will take action to help by making a referral to protect you or your child.

If you do have any safeguarding concerns or would like any information please feel free to speak to a member of management.
